1. Let $S = [1, \infty)$, $d(x, y) = |x - y|$ for $x, y \in S$.
 - (a) Show that (S, d) is a complete metric space.
 - (b) Let $f : S \rightarrow S$ be defined by

$$f(x) = 1 + x + \frac{1}{2x}$$

Show that

$$d(f(x), f(y)) \leq d(x, y)$$

for all $x, y \in S$, with strict inequality if $x \neq y$.

- (c) Show that f has no fixed point. Explain why this does not contradict the Contraction Mapping Theorem.
